THE FIRST READING

2 Samuel 11:26-12:13a

A Reading from the Second Book of Samuel.

When the wife of Uriah heard that her husband was dead, she made lamentation for him. When the mourning was over, David sent and brought her to his house, and she became his wife, and bore him a son.

But the thing that David had done displeased the LORD, and the LORD sent Nathan to David. He came to him, and said to him, "There were two men in a certain city, the one rich and the other poor. The rich man had very many flocks and herds; but the poor man had nothing but one little ewe lamb, which he had bought. He brought it up, and it grew up with him and with his children; it used to eat of his meager fare, and drink from his cup, and lie in his bosom, and it was like a daughter to him. Now there came a traveler to the rich man, and he was loath to take one of his own flock or herd to prepare for the wayfarer who had come to him, but he took the poor man's lamb, and prepared that for the guest who had come to him." Then David's anger was greatly kindled against the man. He said to Nathan, "As the LORD lives, the man who has done this deserves to die; he shall restore the lamb fourfold, because he did this thing, and because he had no pity."

Nathan said to David, "You are the man! Thus says the LORD, the God of Israel: I anointed you king over Israel, and I rescued you from the hand of Saul; I gave you your master's house, and your master's wives into your bosom, and gave you the house of Israel and of Judah; and if that had been too little. I would have added as much more. Why have you despised the word of the LORD, to do what is evil in his sight? You have struck down Uriah the Hittite with the sword, and have taken his wife to be your wife, and have killed him with the sword of the Ammonites. Now therefore the sword shall never depart from your house, for you have despised me, and have taken the wife of Uriah the Hittite to be your wife. Thus says the LORD: I will raise up trouble against you from within your own house; and I will take your wives before your eves, and give them to your neighbor, and he shall lie with your wives in the sight of this very sun. For you did it secretly: but I will do this thing before all Israel, and before the sun." David said to Nathan, "I have sinned against the LORD."

The next day, when the people who remained after the feeding of the five thousand saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they themselves got into the boats and went to Capernaum looking for Jesus.

When they found him on the other side of the sea, they said to him, "Rabbi, when did you come here?" Jesus answered them, "Very truly, I tell you, you are looking for me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate your fill of the loaves. Do not work for the food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For it is on him that God the Father has set his seal." WOMEN OF TYRINGHAM, An Outdoor Site-Specific Oral History Theater Project – <u>UBU Theater</u> will present an original, site-specific oral history theatrical production, "<u>Women of</u> <u>Tyringham</u>," outdoors in the Tyringham Cemetery Field, located on Church Road in Tyringham. Conceived, produced, and directed by Ann Gallo, co-written with author Rachel Urquhart ("The Visionist"), and performed by residents of Tyringham (including our very own Mary Anne Grammer), the play will run July 24, 25, 31, and August 1 at 11 a.m.

Tickets are \$5 for Tyringham residents and relatives, \$15 for nonresidents, and free for children under 12. Tickets can be purchased on day of show only. Bring a lawn chair.

The goal of "Women of Tyringham" is to celebrate and share the unheralded voices of Tyringham's women. Thirty-two audiorecorded interviews were conducted in 2019–20 with a cross section of women from this rural, Berkshire community. The interviews were transcribed and transformed into an original script, bringing to life these women's stories. They share deep aspirations, regrets, moments of happiness, and loss. We experience childhood memories, falling in love, broken marriages, and the joy of a best friend. On the darker side are tales of oppression, alcoholism, and a "me too" moment. We also witness the realities of 18-year-old married mothers, death, loneliness, and the impact these experiences. Ultimately, we embrace the tenacity, strength, and resourcefulness of a Tyringham woman.

The project came about through Ann Gallo's work in the Tyringham Historical Commission's two-room schoolhouse. There she found a stack of cassette that comprised over three decades of oral history interviews with Tyringham residents. As Ann digitized them, she was surprised at how few women had been interviewed. Among 70 recordings, a mere six women had been invited to tell their stories. This vacuum presented an opportunity to enrich the town's oral history archive with voices from the underrepresented 51 percent and to bring them to life through theater.
